The Old Town Square, formerly also the Large Square, today called by many simply "Staromák" is located in the heart of the Old Town. Several significant historical buildings can be found here, for example the Prague Astronomical Clock, the Old Town Hall, or the Tyn Church.



The Prague Castle is the most significant Czech castle. Since the 9th century it was the seat of Czech princes and later kings, and since 1918 it has been the seat of the President. Twice in history it became the seat of the emperor of the Holy Roman Empire. According to the Guinness World Records, it is considered the largest ancient castle in the world.

The Charles Bridge is the oldest existing bridge across the Vltava river and the second oldest preserved bridge in the CR. The Charles Bridge connects two districts, the Old Town and the Lesser Town, and it is a part of the historical royal route.



During the existence of Prague, several world-famous people were born or lived in Prague. Among the most famous were King of Bohemia and Roman Emperor Charles IV., composer Antonín Dvořák, opera singer Ema Destinnová or writers Franz Kafka, Karel Čapek and Jan Neruda. Composer Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart also briefly lived in Prague.

Prague is the capital as well as the largest city in the Czech Republic (CR), located in the middle of Bohemia on the Vltava river. It has been growing for centuries to its present size. Currently, it covers an area of 496 square kilometres and has about 1.2 million inhabitants. "The Capital City of Prague" has been its official name since 1920. The phrase "Prague - the heart of Europe" refers to the position of the metropolis located in the heart of Europe.

According to one legend, Princess Libuše predicted the founding of Prague in her famous prophecy, "I see a great city whose glory will touch the stars. In the forest, as far as you can go in one day, you will find a man working on a wooden threshold (práh). You will name this place Prague after this doorstep."

Prague soon became the centre of an emerging Czech state. Rulers began to manage the surrounding area from the Prague Castle. Even today, the President of the Czech Republic resides in the Prague Castle. The seat of the Czech government, the supreme body of executive power, is also in Prague. The Prague City Hall combines the powers of municipal and regional government.

Historically speaking, the most significant parts of Prague are situated within the territory of today's Prague 1, the medieval heart of the city listed since 1992 on the UNESCO World Heritage List. Almost all of the important tourist destinations in Prague are found here:

The Prague City Hall (MHMP) is the authority in charge of public administration. Its activities are focused on providing services to citizens of the capital city of Prague. It is both a city and regional Authority for the capital city of Prague.

The division of Prague is very complicated. It is useful to know that Prague is divided into 57 independent self-governing city districts/městské části (hereinafter MČ). Out of these MČ, 22 have their own City Halls/městský úřad. Depending on your residency, you belong to a particular city district. Departments (so called "odbory" - such as Trade License Department, General Register Office, Department of Social Care, Department of Education, etc.) are located at each city district. At district city halls, you can resolve a number of important issues related to living in Prague – travel documents and marriage documents; getting a trade licence; a parking card for paid parking zones within the district.

DEPARTMENTS – WHO DOES WHAT

Even though each city district may have different names for its departments, you will find what you actually need at each city district.

MAIN DEPARTMENTS WITHIN THE CITY DISTRICTS:

• **TRADE LICENSE DEPARTMENT** (živnostenský odbor) – in charge of business owners and entrepreneurs – you start your own business here.

• CIVIL REGISTRY (matriční úřad, so-called matrika) – an office that runs the civil register. This office issues documents for weddings - the marriage certificate; child birth – the birth certificate; death – the death certificate; It also deals with citizenship applications, registered partnerships, changes of names/surnames etc.

• **BUILDING DEPARTMENT** (stavební odbor) – issues zoning permits, confirmation of locating a building and its approval, keeps a register of buildings.

• DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL CARE (sociální odbor/odbor sociálních věcí) – mainly focuses on social care and prevention – this department is responsible for oversight of troubled families, children and youth guardians, adult guardians, responds to applications for placements in nursing homes or retirement homes, provides housing for socially underprivileged citizens, issues parking permits for citizens with permanent residency and for citizens with disabilities. So called OSPOD (see Pg. 12) is often within this department.

• **DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION** (odbor školství) – secures, for example, the placement of children in kindergartens/elementary schools in the place of residency; establishes, monitors, and closes schools, coordinates school education plans to ensure high quality of education for children and students.

• **TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT** (odbor dopravy) – issues driving licenses and permits, administers vehicle registrations, etc. In Prague, driving licences are issued at City Hall Business Centre Vysehrad, Na Pankráci 1685/17, 19, Praha 4.

• **DEPARTMENT OF CIVIL ADMINISTRATION** (frequently just a section) – issues personal documents, passports, keeps lists of inhabitants and permanent addresses etc.



Czech POINT

Czech POINT serves as a one-stop shop for public administration services, enabling communication with the state administration at a single location.

Provided services useful for you:

• extracts from the land register, companies register, trades register, criminal record (even for legal persons) or extracts from a penalty-point system for drivers

Czech POINTs are available at some district city halls, at Czech Post branches and some notaries.

Documents that you get at Czech POINT are primarily for the use in the Czech Republic.

RESIDENCY IN THE CZECH REPUBLIC

Two departments within the Ministry of the Interior (Ministerstvo vnitra ČR - MV ČR) are responsible for agendas related to residency in the CR: Foreign Police (Služba cizinecké policie) and the Department for Asylum and Migration Policy (Odbor azylové a migrační politiky).

FOREIGN POLICE

Foreign Police is responsible for issuing short-term visas for up to 90 days, registration of new migrants coming to the CR, random verification of residency permits (e.g. at work, on the street), and penalties for non-compliance with the conditions for residency in the CR

THE DEPARTMENT FOR ASYLUM AND MIGRATION POLICY

(Odbor azylové a migrační politiky - OAMP) OAMP deals with long-term visas, long-term residency and permanent residency permits, temporary residency for EU citizens and their family members, employee cards, biometric ID cards, etc. You have an obligation to report to OAMP any changes related to your place of residency, surname, marital status, change of data in your travel document and document issued as a proof of your residency in the Czech Republic. You must report a change of your address within 30 days, other changes have to be reported within 3 days after their occurrence. Always meet the deadlines!

The Czech Republic has a social security system to which all economically active people contribute. The system provides assistance to socially underprivileged fellow citizens, families with children and other groups. The functioning of this system is rather complicated, consisting of three pillars and several social benefits and contributions.

We offer only a brief overview of how the system works:

1.) SOCIAL INSURANCE

- sickness insurance, retirement income insurance

b) benefits not dependent on the amount of your income - parental allowance, foster care allowance, burial allowance

FAMILY AND CHILDREN

The Czech Republic is a country actively engaged in family policy, and supports families with children.

1.) **Social services** designed to support individual family members or a family as a whole in difficult social situations in order to prevent social exclusion. Social services include: social counselling, social services, and prevention services.

2.) Services to support functioning families, which have preventative and supportive character. Their purpose is to facilitate and strengthen marriages, other partnerships, and parenthood, and provide families with support in child care and harmonisation of work and family. These services are provided by private nursery centres, private nurseries; leisure and educational activities for children (e.g. leisure sports/art/music clubs), maternity centres, etc.

Children and Youth centres (Domy dětí a mládeže) offer leisure activities for children and youth. http://skoly.praha-mesto.cz/parent9429/Urad/Kontakty/Mestske-organizace/area4464

3.) The Department for Social and Legal Protection of Children (Odbor sociálně-právní ochrany dětí - OSPOD) – is a department within social departments at district city halls. OSPOD represents the interests of children in proceedings involving minors (e.g. placement of a child in custody with one of the parents, the amount of alimony, contact of children with their parents).

SAFETY HOTLINE

Safety Hotline (Linka bezpečí) is a free emergency phone line offering assistance to children and youth (up to 26 years). It operates 24 hours per day throughout the year. The hotline provides emergency assistance and counselling to children and adolescents who are in difficult life situations which they cannot manage on their own.



PARENTAL HOTLINE

provides telephone crisis intervention and counselling especially to parents, grandparents and other family members in the whole Czech Republic.

LOW-THRESHOLD CLUBS FOR YOUTH (Nízkoprahové kluby pro mladistvé - NZDM) What does "low-threshold" mean? It is an adjective describing clubs where a child/adolescent can come and take advantage of services offered free of charge. NZDM offer free leisure activities (climbing walls, art workshops, foosball, listening to music, tutoring, etc.). Thanks to NZDM, children spend their free time in a meaningful way in a safe environment.

EDUCATION

The Czech Republic has high quality education at all levels:



Czech schools are state (no fee) and private (with fees, the amount decided by each school individually).

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

• To attend kindergarten, children need to be registered. Registrations run every year from May 2 until May 16. Check exact dates at the specific kindergarten.

• It is obligatory for children to attend one year of pre--school after reaching the age of 5, before starting elementary school. This year of kindergarten is provided free of charge and children registering for this grade should be given priority.

• Elementary school registrations run from April 1 until April 30 every year. Always check exact dates at your school.

• Students are selected for secondary schools on the

basis of results of tests which are designed by the schools themselves, or on the basis of students' year-end report scores; applications are filed by March 1. Always find out dates for submitting applications and dates of entry tests at the given school.

If your child has trouble at school (with attendance, grades, or behaviour), you suspect that he/she suffers from a learning disability, or you just need assistance with choosing the right school, contact counselling facilities at schools, including: Compulsory school attendance applies to children from the age of 6 years and lasts for 9 years.

RECOGNITION OF EDUCATIONAL DIPLOMAS

Recognition of foreign certificates and diplomas (so-called nostrification) is important if you want to continue with your studies in the Czech Republic and when searching for employment.

CZECH LANGUAGE COURSES

Knowledge of the Czech language will not only make your communication with the authorities, potential employers or customers easier, but it will also help you find Czech friends and participate in cultural life. If you have children of school age, knowledge of the Czech language will help you support them in their preparation for school.

If you would like to live in the Czech Republic for the long term, knowledge of Czech language is one of the requirements for obtaining permanent residency and Czech citizenship.

ICP and other non-profit organisations (Pg. 22) offer Czech language courses for beginners, intermediate and advanced students, and also special language courses designed to improve job market competitiveness. These courses are usually offered either for free or for a small fee. You can attend courses over the long term or only occasionally when it suits you (so called low-thre-shold courses/nízkoprahové kurzy). ICP also offers special courses for adults with children where babysitting is provided.

Czech language exam for permanent residency and Czech citizenship

Knowledge of the Czech language (knowledge at a A1 level under the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFRL)) is one of the conditions for obtaining permanent residency and also Czech citizenship (knowledge at a B1 level under CEFRL). To obtain Czech citizenship, you must also pass an exam testing your knowledge of basic facts about the country.

ICP offers Czech language courses to prepare you for the exams!



HEALTHCARE

It is obligatory for everyone in the Czech Republic, including foreigners, to have a duly paid and valid health insurance! The following hospitals and medical facilities specialise in providing medical care to a migrants:

If you cannot find a doctor or are refused by a doctor, contact your health insurance company to provide you with a list of contracted doctors. There is a shortage of specialised doctors in the Czech Republic, so you can be refused because of full capacity.

Always carry your health insurance card on you!

EMPLOYMENT

In case you are not employed or you have lost your job and fulfill legal requirements, you can register at the labour office, which provides unemployment benefits, requalification courses and assists with employment opportunities. Register at a specific labour office according to your place of residence!

REGIONAL LABOUR INSPECTORATES

The main task of labour inspectorates is to monitor compliance with obligations based on labour legislation, including regulations on health and safety at work. In justified cases, labour inspectorates impose sanctions for committing an offense or other violations. If you believe that your employer does not fulfill his/her obligations or otherwise violates your employment contract, submit a complaint at a labour inspectorate.

In the Czech Republic, you can become entrepreneur as a self-employed individual (OSVČ) or a legal entity. To get information about business opportunities, go to the trade department at your local district city hall (Pg. 6) or organisations working with migrants (Pg. 22).

You have to file an annual **tax return** by April 1 of the following year. If you fail to submit your tax return, you expose yourself to large fines, and this transgression can also affect extension of your residency permit in the Czech Republic! Tax returns are filed at the relevant tax office according to the location of your business activity/seat of your company. If your tax return is prepared by a certified tax adviser, the submission deadline is July 1.

TRANSPORTATION

You can use the underground (metro), trams, buses or suburban trains, i.e. public transport (MHD) to travel around Prague. All traffic information. latest news. schedules and travel rules are on the website of the Prague Public Transit Co. (Dopravní podnik hlavního města Prahy - DPP).

 When you travel by any means of transport, you are required to have a valid and properly marked ticket. The ticket is invalid if not marked.

• Tickets can be purchased at vending machines (at metro stations), newsagents or via text messages sent from Czech phone numbers.

• If you travel around Prague regularly and often, it is worth it to buy a travel pass with long-term validity (the so-called Litacka or legitka, or a paper coupon). These long-term passes are available for one month, three months or a year and they carry large discounts compared to short-term tickets. .

Do not forget to mark your ticket at yellow vending machines located at the entrance to metro. trams. buses, and trains. If you do not mark your ticket, it is not valid.

 Ticket inspectors check the validity of your ticket in all types of transport and also at metro stations. They are obliged to show you an inspection badge. You, on the other hand, have to show a valid ticket.

> Warning! If you do not have a valid ticket, you will get a fine of 800/1500 CZK. Furthermore, a ticket inspector will request to see your passport (or other identification) to give you a fine you can pay on the spot or at DPP offices.

PARKING IN PRAGUE

Prague has been gradually introducing paid parking zones. Based on a colour marks on traffic signs, you can tell who and for how long can park at a given location:

• Blue zones are for residents with a long-term parking pass.

• Purple zones are available for unlimited parking by residents who hold long-term parking cards, and for visitors who pay a parking fee for up to 24 hours.

• Orange zones are for short-term parking (max. of 3 hours) visitors paid through parking machines.

• Green zone denotes P+R (Park and Ride) . B+R (Bike and Ride) or K+R (Kiss and Ride) locations. Some underground and train stations have parking lots where you can leave your car or bike and change to public transport for further travel around Prague. K+R are places for short-term stops (up to 5 minutes for unloading or picking up passengers).

MUNICIPAL LIBRARY OF PRAGUE

The Municipal Library lends not only books but also electronic readers, music, movies, and paintings. It organizes cultural events, children's programmes, lectures, seminars, concerts, and theatre performances. Free internet access is available at all library branches.

Non-eu citizens can become library members only when they pay a deposit or with the assistance of a guarantor. What is needed:

• to provide a proof of identity and pay a deposit of 1 000 CZK

• or to provide a proof of identity and request the presence of a guarantor who fulfills conditions for registration as a library member (citizen of the CR or EU).

CULTURE

Participation in cultural and social life is one of the important aspects of integration. Prague has a large network of cultural facilities - theatres, clubs, music halls, dance halls, etc.

ICP is a non-profit organisation operating on the territory of the capital Prague, and provides free-of-charge services to migrants from non-EU countries together with partner non-profit organisations.

• Social consulting – employment and housing search; school search; applications for social benefits and services; accompanying migrants to institutions; resolving health insurance issues.

• Legal consulting – residency applications; residency extensions; appeals; acquiring Czech citizenship

• Accompanying to institutions – assistance in communication with public offices, interpreting and assistance at appointments

• Czech language courses – for beginners, intermediates, advanced, both adults and children. Courses include teaching both grammar and conversation. They will prepare you for A1 level tests within the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFRL).

• Courses of socio-cultural orientation – expert lectures on Czech history, customs and traditions, residency in the Czech Republic; on health, social or educational system in the Czech Republic, tax returns etc.

• **Cultural and community activities** – ICP organises several cultural and community activities around Prague, which aim to bring together locals and migrants and support their friendly cohabitation.

• Information centre – free internet access, foreign-language library with scientific literature, fiction, poetry and foreign-language magazines; information service provided by experienced staff

All services provided by ICP are financed by European Union funds, the Prague city budget and other subsidies and therefore are offered free of charge to ICP clients.
